Course Description

ICD-10-PCS A&P Module: Lymphatic and Hemic System Procedures (07) is designed to enhance coding professionals' knowledge in anatomy, physiology, and pathophysiology terminology for conditions related to the lymphatic and hemic system. It also reviews the ICD-10-PCS codes (07) as it relates to these conditions. This module concludes with a 20-question final self-assessment test to assess your practical knowledge of the skills reviewed.

- Discuss the structure of ICD-10-PCS including the meanings of the 7 characters
- Explain why mastery of root operations is crucial for "building" a correct code
- Compare and contrast the four ICD-10-PCS procedural approaches relevant to 07
- Know when to use root operation "Excision" vs. "Resection"
- Explain the process of referencing a code in the alphabetic index and completing it with a table
- Know the anatomy and understand the physiology of the Lymphatic System
- Recognize the names of various lymph node chains and know their drainage areas
- Understand the objective of the following procedures and be able to code them
 - Biopsy of right popliteal lymph node, open
 - Bilateral radical cervical dissection, open
 - Thymectomy, open, for treatment of thymoma diagnosed in a patient with myasthenia gravis
 - Total splenectomy, laparoscopic, for treatment of idiopathic thrombocytopenic purpura
 - Restriction of thoracic duct with intraluminal stent, percutaneous
 - Fine needle aspiration of right inguinal lymph node in a patient with history of testicular cancer

Bone marrow transplant using donor marrow from identical twin, central vein infusion
